ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION

The following is a SUMMARY, and not a reprint of 2 CSR 30-2.040 Animal Health Requirements for exhibition regulations. Contact the Missouri State Veterinarian's office at (573) 751-4359 for clarification on the following.

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection/General Requirements.
 - A. All animals must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection unless specifically exempted. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall state that the animals are free of visible signs of contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, describe the animal(s) by species, breed, sex and age. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall reflect all data for required test and vaccinations, all dates, results and the name of the laboratory.
 - B. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is valid for thirty (30) days.
 - C. Animals with active lesions of ringworm or warts will not be permitted to exhibit and shall be subject to isolation and expulsion.
 - D. Sales scheduled in association with exhibitions must employ a veterinarian to examine animals and process Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for change of ownership. The following are requirements for animals EXHIBITED in Missouri. Animal sold in addition to being exhibited must meet the entry requirements of Missouri.
2. **EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE IN MISSOURI.**
 - A. Intrastate (cattle in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 1. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required.
 2. Brucellosis – no test or vaccination is required.
 3. Tuberculosis – no test is required.
 - B. Interstate (cattle from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required with official individual identification for each animal listed.
 2. Brucellosis –
 - A. Cattle from Brucellosis-Free States.
 1. Sexually intact cattle may enter without a brucellosis test.
 2. Steer(s). No test required but the steer(s) must be individually identified and listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - B. Cattle from Class A States
 1. Sexually intact test-eligible animals must be tested and negative within thirty (30) days prior to entry except cattle from a certified brucellosis-free herd. The certified herd number and date of the last herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 2. Steer(s). No test required but the steer(s) must be individually identified and listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection
 3. Rodeo bulls from a Class A state must have a negative brucellosis test within twelve (12) months prior to exhibition.
 3. Tuberculosis.
 - A. Beef – Tuberculosis-Free States.
 1. Tuberculosis – Free States. All beef cattle two (2) months of age and over (including steers) may enter without additional testing requirements or permit.
 2. Tuberculosis Status-less than free must meet the following requirements:
 - A. Must obtain an entry permit.
 3. Must have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days of exhibition, test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
 4. Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd (herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection); or
 5. Move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year (date of test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection).
 - B. Dairy – All classes of dairy cattle, two (2) months of age and older, entering Missouri for exhibition must meet the following requirements:
 1. Must obtain an entry permit.
 2. Have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days of shipment; test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
 3. Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd (herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection); or

4. Move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year (date of test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection).
- C. Rodeo livestock, eighteen (18) months of age and older, must be tested negative for tuberculosis every twelve (12) months and obtain an entry permit prior to entering Missouri.
- D. No sexually intact rodeo livestock from Mexico will be permitted to enter Missouri.

3. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR SWINE

- A. Intrastate (swine in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 1. All swine must be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
 2. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
 3. Brucellosis – no test required
 4. Pseudorabies – no test required
- B. Interstate (swine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required. All swine must be individually identified by official eartag, ear notch, tattoo and listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 2. Brucellosis –
 - A. Breeding swine originating from brucellosis-free states may exhibit without a brucellosis test.
 - B. Breeding swine originating from a state having a brucellosis status less than free states must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except breeding swine from a validated brucellosis-free herd. The validated herd number and date of last validating test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. Pseudorabies –
 - A. Swine originating from a state classified as Stage V the National Pseudorabies (PRV) Eradication Plan may exhibit without a pseudorabies test.
 - B. All other swine must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except swine from a qualified pseudorabies-free herd. The qualified herd number and date of last qualifying test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

4. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR SHEEP.

- A. Intrastate (sheep in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 1. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 2. All sheep, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required
- B. Interstate (sheep from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only)
 1. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 2. All sheep, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required

5. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR GOATS.

- A. Intrastate (goats in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required
- B. Interstate (goats from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease
 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required

6. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS EQUINE.

- A. Intrastate (equine in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an Infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required.

3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
- B. Interstate (equine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
 4. Alteration or substitution of any information on any VS Form 10-11 including certified photocopy or certified facsimile or any official copy of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall cause the document to be invalid and in violation of sections 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may result in civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation and subject to expulsion.
 5. A six (6) - month passport from states with which there is a reciprocal agreement will be accepted in lieu of VS Form 10-11. These passports must have proof of a negative EIA test within thirty (30) days of the date of application of the passport and permanent identification for each horse by means of registered brand, legible tattoo, or microchip to be recorded on the passport and the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart, along with other identifying characteristics. In the event of confirmed vesicular stomatitis in any of the states with which reciprocal agreements exist, use of the six (6) - month passport will be suspended by the state veterinarian of Missouri.
 6. Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) vaccination and entry permit is required prior to entry on equine originating from states in which VEE has been diagnosed within the preceding twelve (12) months.
 7. Any equine originating from a premise under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis shall obtain an entry permit and must include the statement on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that "the equine listed have not been exposed to Vesicular Stomatitis or located within (10) miles of premises quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days".
- C. The board, organization or manager of each assembly or event is responsible for certifying that all equine admitted or participating meet the regulations in this section and shall not admit or allow participation of equine not so certified. Untested equine shall not be allowed to congregate with other equine. The owner of each animal shall comply with requirements under this section 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may be assessed civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation.

General Livestock Rules

1. All exhibits must remain in place until released by superintendent in charge of department.
2. All livestock will be released at time given in each department.
3. Exhibitors of livestock will be required to keep stalls in a neat and clean condition.
4. Any exhibitor not complying with the rules of the fair will forfeit his or her premium money.
5. Each exhibitor will furnish own feed, hay, straw, and equipment.
6. Health papers will be required on all breeding stock.
7. Superintendent of department will assign stalls or pens.
8. Livestock showing any clinical evidence of disease will NOT be permitted to enter the fairgrounds.

General Rules

1. Beef Show will be open to everyone.
2. Cattle may come in Friday, July 12th after 3 pm and should be in place by 8:00 pm. Cattle may also come in Saturday AM and need to be in place no later than 7:30 am. Show will be held in conjunction with the 4-H/FFA Beef Show.
3. An entry Fee of \$5.00 per head per class will be charged to all exhibitors.
4. Open Show entries should be mailed/called to Angie Hamlin, 17506 St Hwy 156, Ewing, MO 63440, 573-494-3308 by July 12, 2013. Junior Show entries that wish to show in the Open Show must make entries by 8:15 am show day.
5. Registration Papers must accompany each animal over 1 year of age. Animals under 1 year must be accompanied by registration papers of the dam and proof of registration of the sire. Exotic breeds must be 3/4 breed or greater to be eligible to show.
6. Health Papers must accompany each animal (see health regulations) for those coming out of state.
7. An exhibitor may make as many entries as he/she wishes but will be awarded not more than two cash prizes in any one class.
8. Classes will be made available for breeds not listed if more than one herd is exhibited; if not, exhibitor may show with another breed.
9. No trimming chutes will be allowed in the barn. Generators are suggested.
10. Calves born after April 1 can show with cow and calf.
11. Cattle may not leave fairgrounds after once in place.
12. Bucket Calf classes for ages 12 & under. Exhibitors showing in judged classes are not eligible to show in the bucket calf classes.

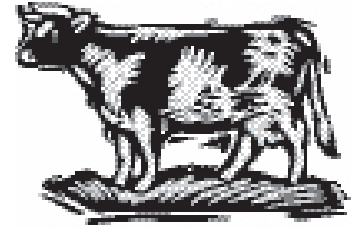

1. The Sheep Show will be open to everyone.
2. Open Show entries are due by July 10, 2013 to Kristy Elder, except for persons showing in the Lewis County Junior Sheep Show. These entries are due on show day before the Junior Show starts. Late entries will be accepted only with permission of the superintendent. Late entries are to made by telephone to Kristy Elder.
3. Open Show will start at 11:00 AM Friday.
4. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
5. All sheep, including wethers, must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or a paper copy of an electronic Certificate of Veterinary Inspection showing official identification (eartag, electronic implant or registration tattoo) as defined in Part 79 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
7. All sheep entered must be recorded in their respective breed association in order to show.
8. Registration papers must be furnished when asked for by the superintendents.
9. All yearlings must show only yearling teeth. No exceptions will be allowed.
10. Junior lamb class entries must be born on or after Jan. 1, 2013.
11. Lambs showing in Market Lamb Class may be ewes or wethers.
12. In MARKET LAMB CLASS – All breeds will show together.
13. Each exhibitor must furnish their own feed, hay and straw.
14. Each exhibitor will be allowed only one entry in each pair and group classes per breed.
15. An entry fee of \$5.00 per head per class will be charged. Group classes will be \$5.00 per group.
16. All money will be collected after sheep are penned on grounds.
17. Premiums will be paid as follows: 100% of all entry fees, PLUS matching funds by Lewis County Fair Association.

RULES FOR SENIOR AND JUNIOR DIVISION

1. Entries will be accepted Tuesday, July 9th, 3:00 PM - 7:30 PM and Wednesday July 10th, 7:30 AM - 10:00 AM. They will be released after 5:00 PM on Saturday, July 13th. Pre-registration of exhibits is not required. Building will be closed for judging from 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Wednesday.
2. All exhibits must remain in place until 5:00 PM on Saturday, July 13th. NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ITEMS NOT PICKED UP BY 6:00 PM.
3. Fair, or show committees will exercise all care, but they cannot be responsible for breakage, of loss of items exhibited.
4. Entry must state who made the article and, if it is entered by another person, who entered the article.
5. Articles MADE by exhibitors age 19 and over must be entered in the Senior Classes of the Home Economics Show. All articles MADE by exhibitors age 18 and under must be entered in the Junior Class. Age must be given on the Junior Classes.
6. Individuals who sell their products will have exhibits entered in the PROFESSIONAL CLASSES in Senior Crafts. Rosettes and Ribbons only will be awarded in Professional Classes.
7. If there are less than 3 articles in any category, the article may (at the discretion of the judges) be transferred to miscellaneous in that category. Exhibitors having items for a class not listed may enter exhibits in a miscellaneous class. If too many articles are entered in any one class, they will be divided into different classes for judging.
8. No one but the judges, superintendent, and helper, shall be in the judging section of the building during time of judging.
9. Senior Classes - A Blue, Red, and White will be awarded in each class. A Best of Show Rosette along with a \$5.00 Cash Prize and Honorable Mention Rosette will be awarded per category.
Junior Classes - A Blue, Red, and White will be awarded upon merit of the judges. Each entry will receive a ribbon. A Best of Show Rosette along with a \$5.00 Cash Prize and Honorable Mention Rosette will be awarded per category.
10. If First Place is given on any article, the article may never again be entered in the Lewis County Fair.
11. No articles may be removed until the date of removal. If an article is removed, all ribbons will be forfeited.
12. Quilts must be entered under QUILTS. No quilts will be accepted under Embroidery, Applique, etc. ALL QUILTS AND AFGHANS WILL BE SHOWN IN THE "COUNTRY CLASSIC" QUILT SHOW, WEDNESDAY, JULY 10, 4:30 PM. The following information should be included day of entry: Who made the quilts or afghan; Exhibitor; Pattern; Approximate age of quilt or afghan, any pertinent facts.
13. All embroidery, painting and needle work will be judged on the handwork only and not on the framing, unless they are to be hung.
14. In Classes D-G-J-U, any picture to be hung must have a hook or wire for hanging.
